Next Thursday (2/21/2013), Archivist Larry Hibpshman will give the second lecture in the Kashevarof Noon Winter Lecture Series:

They Anointed Our Waters & Our Cup Runneth Over: Litigation Records from the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill

Litigation associated with the 1989 Exxon Valdez oil spill involved thousands of people and spawned millions of documents. Larry Hibpshman, Director of the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Litigation Records Appraisal and Processing Project, oversees the two-year effort to decide what to preserve and how to make it accessible. Hibpshman will describe the collection, this project and what it means to people in Alaska.

"WHEN CRAB WAS KING ON DISPLAY AT LOUSSAC LIBRARY"

Kodiak Maritime Museum's exhibit, "When Crab Was King: Faces of the Kodiak King Crab Fishery, 1950-1982," runs through February 28th on Level 3 at the Loussac Library in Anchorage. The exhibit features large format portraits of fishermen, cannery workers and others who lived through the King Crab boom in Kodiak. A cell phone tour accompanies the exhibit, allowing visitors to hear the people in the portraits talk about their experiences in one of the world's great fisheries.
