Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Hi Katie, LaRue, Jerrie

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): We are just waiting for a few others to join in

Katie Oliver: Hi everyone

Jerrie Clarke: Hi

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Hi Aaron

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Great we are getting lots of people on now.

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): we will start in just a moment

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): One person is having trouble loggin on and I am trying to help them

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Hi Monica

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): on the map of AK

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Just click on the letter to the left of the map

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): then click on where you are and write

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): It is a good way to get used to writing on the whiteboard

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): this may come in handy at some future chat

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Chris what about you in K-town?

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): I will have to work on getting those Barrow folks to join us again

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Thanks Chris

Chris Hanson: I had to figure our where I was...lol

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Ok We can start with any questions that people have

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Or any burning museum topics

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Has anyone heard of the Crreation Museum in Wasilla?

Moderator (Scott Neel): I have heard of it but not been.

Katie Oliver: Read about it in the ADN online

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): It is true then?

Cordova Historical Museum: Never heard of it

Monica Shah: I haven't visited, but quite a few from here have. It's supposed to be interesting.

Gary Minish: Haven't heard of it.

Moderator (Scott Neel): Yes, it is true

aaron leggett: Did anyone see that Tlingit helmet we looked at a couple of weeks ago is know on Ebay?

Chris Hanson: I read an article about it in the paper....sounds interesting!

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Aaron are you serious?

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): You mean the one with the deer antlers?

Eleanor: how much going for?

Jerrie Clarke: Is that the one I sent to the List?

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Hi Sara nice to have you

aaron leggett: Indeed its starting at \$1500

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Wow I hope he did not quote any of us on it

Jerrie Clarke: Holy Moly! I'd better let our local artists know they can charge more.

Chris Hanson: Was the artist ever identified?

aaron leggett: They did "I have a beautiful war helmet that comes from the Tlingit tribe. I have had several museums look at it, and although they have not been able to identify the maker, they all agree that it is a ceremonial war helmet from the First Nations area. Several have commented that it looks like Tommy Joseph's work, however it is not his signature inside. It is carved out of cedar and the eyes are mother of pearl. It is signed and dated 76'. It has been well used as the nose has been rubbed to a shine. The deer is a sign of peace in the Tlingit ceremony. Really a nice piece. Good Luck!"

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): That is interesting

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): makes me wonder about commenting on it

Monica Shah: Who's selling it?

Moderator (Scott Neel): Makes me really hesitant to help people coming to ask questions when we don't know what they are going to do with the information.

Eleanor: That is always my worry about people asking about these

Eleanor: This way they can put a value on it based on what we say or not say

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): I agree with you Elenanor

Jerrie Clarke: I forwarded the responses. Perhaps that wasn't such a good idea.

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): But what could we do

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): It seemed like a legit question

Eleanor: maybe we should ask why they are asking for information

Jennifer McCarty: Sorry I joined a bit late; is there supposed to be sound with this chat?

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): There will be, we are just typing the chat now, After we are done with the questions , we will do some speaking

Jennifer McCarty: ok thank you.

Eleanor: and what will they do with the information

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): That is a good idea

aaron leggett: You can always ask them what why they are inquiring

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Thanks Aaron for bringing up that important topic

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Anyone else have questions or comments

Marnie and Jill: HVAC - any recommendations for service / maintenance? Any suggestions for types of systems, HVAC specialists, etc.?

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Good question

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): I will throw that out to the field

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): I have to admit it is not one of my strong points

Marnie and Jill: Who does your maintenance, do you like them?

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): I know that Bob Banghart did send a recommendation to Amy Steffian

Monica Shah: I can ask our building engineer. Ever since he started, our HVAC has been operating better. He's on top of the maintenance.

Monica Shah: I'll send his response to you directly Marnie.

Monica Shah: Weekly/Monthly checks have made all the difference.

Sara Lee: On maintenance topic, I'd suggest doing a session that that is a focus and we could get the people on chat that know the most about it. Here at ASM we have State employees doing the HVAC maintenance.

Monica Shah: It's reduced particulates and made our system more stable.

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): If anyone wants to use dataloggers to monitor their climate I have new ones to send out

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): That is a good idea Sara.

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): I will make a note of it

Monica Shah: Scott, have you found any of your HOBOS losing their accuracy in less than one year?

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): No

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Generally hobos are pretty good

Moderator (Scott Neel): We haven't either

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): we have switched to PEM2 s

Marnie and Jill: Scott, you have ones to send out?

Monica Shah: Our HOBOS that also monitor light levels are responding to trends, but the RH is off by 5%.

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Yes I actually have two I can send you

Marnie and Jill: Are you supposed to re-calibrate HOBOS every so often?

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): You can use them for 6 months and download monthly to the web

Moderator (Scott Neel): I think you can send them into the company and they will re-calibrate.

Moderator (Scott Neel): Of course costs money.

Monica Shah: I have our HOBOS calibrated every 2-3 years. I just dont think it should be every year...which is what is happening with the ones with light sensors.

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): I am not sure that 5% is all that significant for HOBOS

Monica Shah: Good point Scott.

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): HOBOS are just not set up to be that accurate

Chris Hanson: I seem to remember they are supposed to be accurate to within 1-2% but I have imagined that.

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): I thought it was more like 5%

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): But I can check on it

Marnie and Jill: How accurate are the PEM2s?

Monica Shah: Our ones that do just Temp/RH have been very good. I check bi-monthly with an Elsec. Usually within <.5%

Chris Hanson: 5% seems excessive....but I can check the website real quickly...

Marnie and Jill: Why did you switch?

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): They are more accurate but I am not sure of the specs

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): We switched primarily because the PEMs have a web access component

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): So I send the PEM to you and you can download to the web

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): then we both can look at the data

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): before you had to send it back to me

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): then I downloaded the data

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): then sent it back to you

Chris Hanson: plus or minus 2.5% to plus or minus 3.5% depending on the temp

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Thanks Chris

Chris Hanson: That is for the latest wireless models

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): The cheaper HOBOS may not have been that accurate

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): Any other questions before we start the LED discussion?

Chris Hanson: less than 1% drift on the older U10s

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): That is better than I thought

Jennifer McCarty: Was there already discussion on museum sustainability then?

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): No that will start in a few minutes

Monica Shah: I guess I was surprised with the 5% off, since the others are less than half percent off, generally.

Chris Hanson: Seems high to me

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): You may just have a bad one

Monica Shah: True.

aaron leggett: We had a bad one at the center a few years ago

Chris Hanson: They should replace it if it is that new and can't hold to their specs...

aaron leggett: Yeah we they finally replace ours

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): OK we should probably get started with the LED discussion

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): I hope everyone has speakers or a headphone

Moderator (Scott Carrlee): I am going to mic on now so you should hear my voice

Moderator (LAM) to Scott Carrlee: If you're not hearing Scott Neel, please put up a frowny face or thumbs down.

Marnie and Jill: Does the hall have lights besides what's in the case?

Marnie and Jill: Yes

Monica Shah: who was your supplier?

LaRue Barnes: what do you use for more than one sided display? not wall but an open case

Monica Shah: thanks

Marnie and Jill: Where did you order bulbs from?

LaRue Barnes: thanks

Marnie and Jill: So how do you know what CRI or whatnot to choose?

Jerrie Clarke: This has been good. Thanks for doing it. I was planning for PAR 20 bulbs and I haven't seen them mentioned.

Jennifer McCarty: Is there a very initial high cost investment when switching to LED lights as opposed to halogen bulbs?

Jennifer McCarty: So you're saying that it is more of a cost investment in the beginning, but in the end it pays off?

Marnie and Jill: Who did you work with?

Jerrie Clarke: Thank you.

Marnie and Jill: Thanks Scott.
