Partial Eclipse Activities at the Alaska State Libraries, Archives, and Museum

JUNEAU – On Monday, August 21, the Alaska State Library, Archives, and Museum will have eclipse-related activities at the Father Andrew P. Kashevaroff State Libraries, Archives, and Museum at 395 Whittier St. If the skies are clear, participants can make pinhole eclipse viewers on Pivot Plaza by Nimbus and a limited number of eclipse-viewing glasses will be available. The activities begin at 8:30 am and maximum eclipse time is at 9:19 am.

If the weather doesn't cooperate, there will be space activities inside the APK, and the total eclipse will be livestreamed in the lecture hall starting at 9 am. Museum visitors can also see solar and eclipse-related views on the Science-on-a-Sphere exhibit. Regular museum admission rates apply.
