About GIA

- 1971: First Grant-in-Aid awards issued
- Governed by AS 14.57.010 and 4 AAC 58.200
- Annual legislative appropriation. Typically \$105,600 available

Eligibility

- Non-profit or tribal organization with education mission
- Owns, cares for, exhibits tangible objects
- Open to the public 90 days a year
- One full time staff or FTE equivalent engaged in collections care and exhibition
- Completed previous GIA projects
- Maintain separate financial records from parent org, if applicable
- Not a state or federal agency
- Non-profit organization dedicated to augment and enhancing statewide museum services

GIA Programs

- Regular Grant: up to \$10,000
- Mini Grant: up to \$2,000
- Internship Grant: \$4500 for the 8 week internship with free housing for intern

You can apply for only one grant per year

Each grant has a separate application form and review rubric

Program Changes: All Grants

- New grant submission platform (LibWizard)
- New grant templates
- New review rubrics, as indicated in the templates
- New budget revision request
- Draft review deadline: May 10

Program Changes: Regular and Mini Grants

- Up to 10% of grant funds may go to indirect and administrative costs
- Funds can be used for professional development and training expenses IF the training is germane to the project
- Changes to the review rubrics

Program Changes: Internship Program

- It's back!
- Applicants must have a discrete project that will benefit both the museum and the intern. Projects will be used for recruitment/ selection.
- Non-collections projects are accepted
- Museums must be available during the interview and orientation process
